Dear Twombly Community,

Welcome back to Twombly Elementary for the 2010-2011 school year. I hope you all had a great break and are ready to start an exciting new year. Our focus and vision for this year is to ensure academic excellence in an emotionally and physically safe environment. We have many new and exciting opportunities this year, starting with a new Assistant Principal, Mr. Scott VanLoo.

“My name is Scott VanLoo and I am so excited to be the new Assistant Principal and a part of the Twombly Elementary Family! For the past six years, I have worked in the Johnstown/Milliken schools as a Special Education teacher and in district administration in charge of English as a Second Language, Migrant Education and homeless student programs. Prior to that, I was the Director of the César Chávez Cultural Center at the University of Northern Colorado. I have worked in education for the past 14 years, including teaching on the island of Guam and in the mountains of Colorado. I was born in San Diego, California but have grown up and lived in and around the Greeley area for most of my life. This summer, I will be spending time with my two boys and my family, watching the world cup, playing soccer and tennis, traveling and playing music. I am looking forward to meeting everyone at Twombly so please come by and say ‘hello’ when school starts in August.

Just before the school year ended we were awarded a grant which enabled us to send our fourth grade team to California over the summer for training with AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination). The program targets students who have the desire to go to college and the willingness to work hard. AVID prepares students to succeed in rigorous curricula, build organizational skills for school and home, and increase their opportunities to enroll in four-year colleges. We are very excited to be on the ground floor of introducing AVID to elementary students and to give them a head start in preparing for their future.

Mrs. Moser will be joined this year with a School Librarian to start working towards our vision of a Power Library. This opportunity will provide support for research projects, integration of curriculum subjects, increased technology awareness and 21st Century learning skills. Research shows that well-staffed, well-stocked media centers can contribute to increased CSAP scores by as much as 18% higher than in those schools without such programs.

We revised our daily schedule to ensure a three hour literacy block and a minimum of an hour and a half for math. Our teachers have already started researching the new Colorado Academic Achievement Standards along with curriculum mapping using the District approved programs. This pre-planning and integrated approach will help keep our focus on academic excellence throughout the year. Per the request of several parents we also looked at the lunch and recess schedule to guarantee that each student gets an uninterrupted 30 minute lunch period and a 20 minute recess break during the day. Lunch and recess will not be attached as to break up their schedule so they have planned movement breaks throughout the day. Please check with your child’s teacher for the new schedule, we love it when parents join us for lunch.

We heard your request to look into the drop-off/pick-up situation here at Twombly. Our plan is to have families with the last name beginning with A-M use the far west parking lot (teacher parking lot) for drop-off and pick-up. Families with the last name beginning with N-Z would use the front of the building parking lot for drop-off and pick-up. For safety reasons only allow your child to get out of the car at the curb (hug and go zones), do not park and leave your car unattended in along the curbs, this is the number one cause of traffic back-up. If you need to park to bring your child into the building, please use the front lot parking spaces. Hopefully this will break up the congestion and will help eliminate most of our tardies. Breakfast and supervision starts at 7:10 am and is served till 7:40 am. Please do not drop your child off at the school before this time because there is no one on supervision in which to assure their safety. Parents are welcome to eat breakfast with your child(ren) or wait with them in the lobby. On days in which it is warmer than 25° and dry (including wind chill – District Policy is 20°) it will be an outside day, please have students dress appropriate because 25° is still very cold and we want to assure they are healthy. We encourage our students to line up outside with their classmates for social time prior to the beginning of the school day. This is especially important as they start the school year to meet new friends and to get caught up with everyone else. It also helps create independence in your child and will ease their separation anxiety. Our day ends at 3:00 pm, when children are checked out early it is still counted as an early release tardy, please be aware that three tardies on either end of the day add up to one full day absence. Our school attendance goal is 97% this year (approximately 5 absences per year).

We look forward to a very successful school year and hope that you will not only feel welcome in our building, but that you know that we value your contributions and ideas. There are several opportunities for parents and or community members to become involved with the school this year. As always we encourage you to visit your child’s classroom, join him/her for breakfast or lunch, volunteering within the school, participating in our parent advisory group, PTSA and or joining our School Accountability Committee. If you are interested in any of these opportunities please check with our school Parent Liaison, Maria Diaz or Dora Garcia, Lead Secretary and they will get you set up. My door is always open and I would love to have a cup of coffee with you to hear your suggestions, or just get to know you better, please stop by anytime. We know that when parents are involved in their child’s education, kids do better in school and enjoy it more. By working together we will achieve our goal of academic excellence this year.

Estimada Comunidad de Twombly:

Bienvenidos al año escolar 2010-2011 de la Escuela Primaria Twombly. Espero que todos ustedes hayan tenido unas maravillosas vacaciones y que se encuentren listos para comenzar un excitante nuevo año. Nuestro enfoque y visión para este año es el de asegurar la excelencia académica en un ambiente de seguridad tanto emocional como físico. Tenemos muchas nuevas y excitantes oportunidades este año, comenzando con un nuevo Asistente de Director, el Sr. Scott VanLoo.

Justamente antes de que terminara el año escolar fuimos premiados con una suma de dinero que nos permitirá enviar a nuestro equipo de cuarto año a California durante el verano para recibir entrenamiento con AVID (Vía Avanzada de Determinación Individual). El programa se dirige a aquellos estudiantes que tienen el deseo de ir a un colegio y están dispuestos a trabajar duro. AVID prepara a los estudiantes a tener éxito en el programa escolar, a construir sus conocimientos de organización para la escuela y para sus hogares, aumenta las oportunidades de matricularse en colegios de cuatro años. Nos sentimos muy contentos de ser los cimientos para introducir AVID a los estudiantes de primaria y darles un comienzo en la preparación de su futuro.

La Sra. Moser se reunirá este año con una Bibliotecaria Escolar para dar comienzo a nuestra visión de una Biblioteca con Poder. Esta oportunidad proporcionará apoyo hacia los proyectos de investigación, la integración de materias del programa escolar, aumentar los conocimientos de la tecnología y aprender los conocimientos del Siglo 21. Las investigaciones demuestran que un buen personal, centros de biblioteca con suficientes libros pueden contribuir al aumento de las calificaciones en las pruebas de CSAP por un 18% o más que aquellas escuelas que no tienen dichos programas.

Hemos revisado nuestro horario de todos los días para asegurarnos de tener un cuadro de tres horas en lectura y un mínimo de una hora y media en matemáticas. Nuestros maestros y maestras ya han comenzado a investigar el nuevo Programa de Normas para la Capacidad en Colorado (Colorado Academic Achievement Standards) junto con el planeo de los programas escolares aprobados por el Distrito. Esta preplantación y vía de acceso integrada nos mantendrá enfocados en la excelencia académica durante todo el año escolar. Bajo la petición de varios padres también hemos revisado el horario de las comidas y los recreos para garantizar que cada estudiante tenga 30 minutos interrumpidos de comida y 20 minutos de recreo durante el día. Las comidas y los recreos no serán motivo para interrumpir su horario ya que se han planeado descansos durante todo el día. Favor de hablar con el maestro(a) de su hijo(a) para obtener el nuevo horario, nos encanta tener a nuestros padres durante la hora de la comida.

Escuchamos sus peticiones sobre la situación de las dejadas y levantadas de sus niños aquí en Twombly. Nuestro plan es que las familias que tienen apellidos que comienzan de la A-M usen el estacionamiento al oeste (estacionamiento para maestros) para dejar y levantar a sus niños. Las familias con el apellido comenzando con N-Z podrán usar el estacionamiento al frente del edificio para dejar y levantar a sus niños. Por razones de seguridad únicamente permitan que su niño(a) se baje de su carro en la curva, no se estacionen y deje su vehículo desatendido en las curvas, esta es la razón número uno por la aglomeración de tráfico. Si necesita usted estacionarse para traer a su niño(a) dentro del edificio, favor de usar los espacios en el estacionamiento de enfrente de la escuela. Esperamos que esto elimine la congestión y la mayoría de los retardos. El desayuno y la supervisión comienzan a las 7:10 AM y es servido hasta las 7:40 AM. Favor de no dejar a su niño(a) antes de esta hora ya que no hay supervisión la cual asegure la seguridad del estudiante. Los padres son bienvenidos a tomar su desayuno con su niño o niños o a esperarlos en la sala a la entrada de la escuela. Durante los días en que la temperatura sea mas calientita de 25° y seco (incluyendo el viento – la Regal del Distrito es de 2°) este será un día en que los estudiantes podrán salir afuera, por favor haga que sus estudiantes se vistan apropiadamente ya que 25° es aún muy frío y deseamos asegurar que permanezcan saludables. Animamos a nuestros estudiantes a que se formen afuera con sus compañeros para tener un tiempo social antes de comenzar el día de clases. Esto es especialmente importante ya que ellos comienzan el año escolar y conocerán a nuevos amigos. También ayuda a crear la independencia en sus niños y separarse de la tensión nerviosa. Nuestro día concluye a las 3:00 PM, cuanto los niños salen temprano, es aún contado como retardo, favor de estar pendiente de que tres retardos al terminar cualquier día de clases cuenta como un día completo de falta de asistencia. Nuestra meta escolar para la asistencia es de 97% este año (aproximadamente 5 faltas de asistencia anuales).

Esperamos tener un excitante año escolar y a la misma vez que ustedes no solamente se sientan bienvenidos a nuestro edificio, pero que sepan que valoramos sus contribuciones y sus ideas. Existen varias oportunidades para que los padres y miembros de la comunidad se envuelvan con las escuelas este año. Como siempre los animamos a visitar el salón de clases de sus niños, acompáñelos a desayunar o a comer, sea voluntario, participen en nuestro grupo de padres consejeros, el PTSA o nuestro comité llamado School Accountability Committee. Si esta usted interesado en cualquiera de estas oportunidades favor de hablar con nuestras personas encargadas del enlace entre los padres y la escuela, Maria Diaz o Dora Garcia, la Secretaria de la escuela y ellas le ayudarán. Mi puerta siempre está abierta y me encantaría tener una taza de café con usted y poder escuchar sus sugerencias, o simplemente para conocerlo mejor, favor de parar a cualquier hora. Sabemos que cuando los padres se envuelven en la educación de sus hijos, el desempeño de los niños es mejor y la disfrutan más. Al trabajar juntos podemos realizar nuestra meta académica de excelencia para este año.

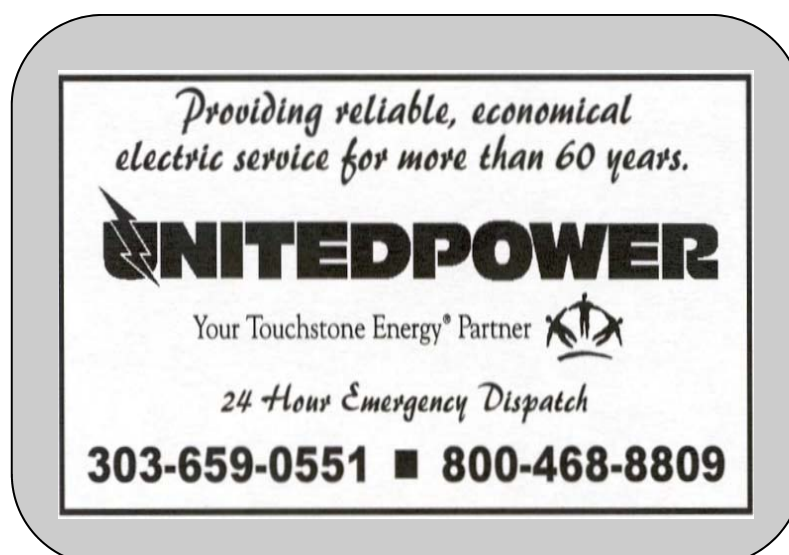

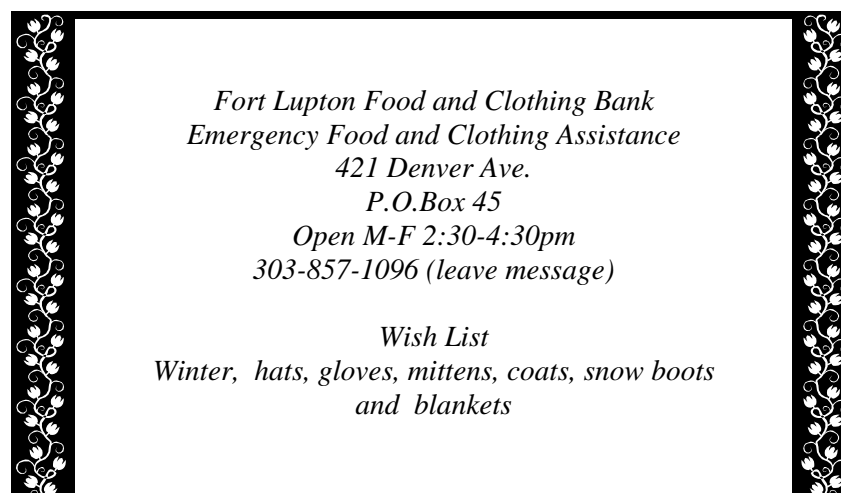

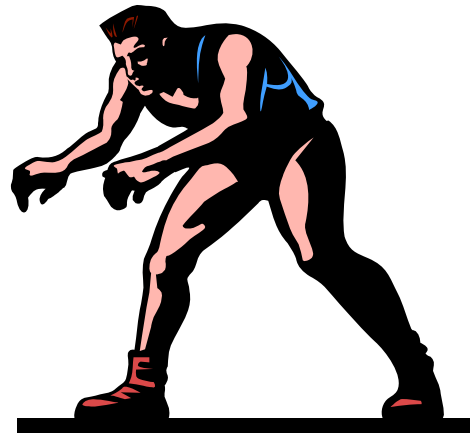

What's New from Your High School Counseling Office

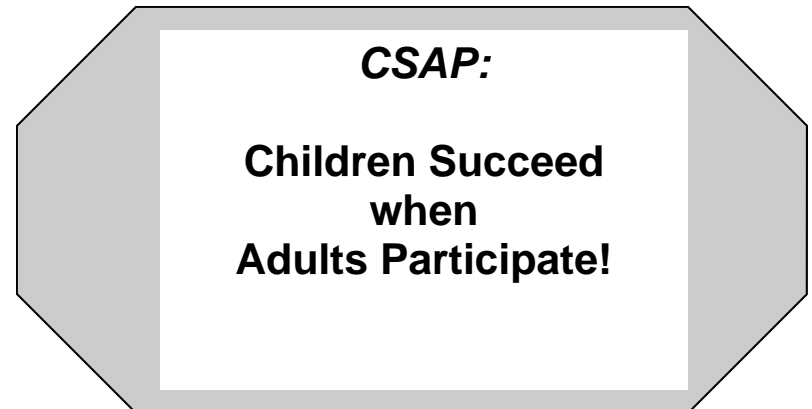

Snow Day Information

While it's summer and hard to think about snow, before long the flakes will be falling. Keep in mind that we do live in Colorado – known for our abundant snow. Here is what we think about when making a decision about declaring a Snow Day:

- Student safety is the first priority in making decisions regarding school closure. However, parents, students, and employees must realize that we live in Colorado where driving in some snow and bad weather conditions is reasonable and expected, and school cannot be called off whenever there is the slightest amount of snow and/or ice.
- Parents have the ultimate responsibility for the safety of their children; therefore, if a parent feels it is too dangerous for his/her child to go to school, even if he/she rides the bus, they may keep them home and the absence will be excused.
- Parents, students and employees should always assume that there would be school as scheduled, unless they see an announcement on TV, hear an announcement on radio, or receive a phone call as part of the official phone tree.
- Parents, students and employees should not call the schools or offices to see if school will be held since those phone lines will be needed to communicate to employees if a decision has been made to change things.

We will do our best to make a decision as early as possible, and every attempt will be made to make the decision the night before if a substantial winter storm is emanate. If we can't make a decision the night before, we will try to make the decision by no later than 6 am. Our goal is to give our families as much time as possible to prepare for students that may need to spend the day at home.

At times, the snow may be such that it snows during the night but we may have to delay the opening of school for several hours. If we DELAY the start of school everything will shift back by the number of hours we delay school. **THERE WILL BE NO MORNING PRE-SCHOOL IF WE DO A DELAYED START OF SCHOOL.** For example, if your student is normally picked up by the bus at 7 am, and we are on a 2 hour delayed start, then you can expect your child to be picked up at 8 am. School will close for the day at the normal hours.

If we have a Snow Day, all activities, including sports scheduled for that day, will be cancelled as well.

If we close or delay the start of school, you can expect to get a phone message, in English and Spanish, from the Superintendent of Schools, Mark Payler. You may also check our website (www.ftlupton.k12.co.us) or Facebook page for an update as well. In addition, Denver major television stations and some area radio stations will carry news of the closure as well.

We take our children's safety seriously and will do all we can to ensure their well-being.

Mientras que nos encontramos en el verano es difícil pensar en la nieve, y que dentro de poco caerán plumas de nieve. Recuerden que vivimos en Colorado – conocido por sus abundantes nevadas. Esto es lo que nosotros pensamos sobre cuando tenemos que hacer una decisión para declarar que es un Día Nevado:

- La seguridad de los estudiantes es una de las principales prioridades al hacer decisiones para el cierre de las escuelas. Sin embargo, los padres, estudiantes, y empleados deberán darse cuenta de que vivimos en Colorado en donde el manejar con algo de nieve o malas condiciones de tiempo es razonable y es esperado, y no se podrán cerrar las escuelas cuando haya la menor cantidad de nieve y/o hielo.
- Los padres tienen la última responsabilidad sobre la seguridad de sus niños; por lo tanto, si un padre siente que es demasiado peligroso para su niño(a) el ir a la escuela, aún cuando el o ella tenga uso del transporte escolar, ellos podrán conservarlos en sus casas y la falta de asistencia será excusada.
- Los padres, estudiantes y empleados deberían siempre asumir que habrá clases, a menos que ellos vean un anuncio en la televisión, o escuchen un anuncio en la radio, o reciban una llamada oficial por teléfono de parte de las personas encargadas de llamar a personas en sus listas.
- Los padres, estudiantes y empleados no deberán llamar a las escuelas ni a las oficinas para ver habrá clases ya que estas líneas telefónicas serán necesitadas para comunicarnos con los empleados si la decisión ha sido cambiada.

Nuestro propósito es el de tomar una decisión lo mas temprano posible, y todo intento al hacer esta decisión será hecho la noche anterior si se espera una fuerte tormenta de nieve. Si no podemos hacer una decisión la noche anterior, trataremos de hacer la decisión no mas tarde de las 6 AM. Nuestra meta es la de darles a nuestras familias tanto tiempo como sea posible para que preparen a los estudiantes que tendrán que necesitar pasar el día en casa.

En veces, la nevada durante la noche será tanta que trataremos de retardar la apertura de la escuela por varias horas. Si **RETARDAMOS** el comienzo de las clases todo será cambiado de acuerdo con el número de horas que hubo de retardo. **NO HABRA CLASES PARA LOS ESTUDIANTES EN PREESCOLAR SI EL COMIENZO DE LAS CLASES HA SIDO RETRASADO.** Por ejemplo, si un estudiante normalmente es levantado por el camión a las 7 AM, y tenemos 2 horas de retraso, entonces podrá usted esperar que su hijo (a) sea levantado a las 8 AM. La escuela terminará a la hora normal.

Si tenemos un Día Nevado, todas las actividades, incluyendo los deportes para ese día, serán cancelados también.

Si cerramos o retardamos el comienzo de las clases, podrá usted esperar un mensaje telefónico, en Inglés y Español, de parte del Superintendente de Escuelas, Mark Payler. Podrá usted también visitar nuestro website (www.ftlupton.k12.co.us) o la página de Facebook para darles la última información. Además, los canales de televisión de Denver y algunas estaciones de radio darán las noticias del cierre de escuelas también.

CHARGING MEALS

Elementary students will be allowed to charge a meal. If it becomes necessary for the elementary student to charge, payment must be sent the next school day. A **maximum** of only 2 meal charges for your Elementary student is allowed. After 2 charges, student will receive a courtesy meal of a peanut butter sandwich and milk if money is not received or a meal from home is not sent. Charges are **not permitted** at the High School or Middle School. Students are encouraged to borrow from a friend or call parents to bring them money or a meal.

It is not the intent of Food Services to let a child go hungry, but it is the responsibility of the parent to provide for the student's breakfast and lunch needs. Food Services will notify each student when their individual account balance is low on funds.

ONE APPLICATION PER FAMILY.

- 3) Income by source for all household members.

Your eligibility may be checked at any time during the school year. School officials may ask you to provide documentation showing that your children are eligible for free or reduced price meals.

Voluntary Incentive Paths (VIP) Summary, 2009-2010

Teacher Incentive Fund (TIF) Project

Twombly Elementary was the place to be on Thursday, May 6 as teachers showcased projects they have worked on this year in the VIP program, part of the Weld Re-8 Performance Pay plan. The lobby, library and technology lab were a whirlwind of activity with display charts, PowerPoint presentations, and animations on Promethean Boards.

Teacher teams and individuals took on special projects to impact student achievement. Most conducted Action Research, trying and continually evaluating specific, targeted techniques with students to raise scores on a specific assessment used in their school. Others simply tried to meet a pre-determined – and published – student assessment goal. Several projects by teachers who do not use such assessments targeted goals in their School Improvement Plans.

The VIP Lesson Fair was the culmination of the first year of the VIP program. In all, 29 teachers participated in 15 projects. All of the participants expanded their own learning and teaching skills. Those who meet their goals receive bonuses of up to \$1,000.

The program has been approved for continuation in the 2010-2011 school year, with funding for 50 teacher participants.

For 2009-2010, VIP applications were accepted in three categories:

Action Research (TRIP, Teacher Research for Improved Practice): 4 teams and 7 individuals submitted applications. One individual dropped out of the project early in the year, and one individual did not complete the research project. Of those who completed their research, all four teams and four individuals met their goals. They received two bonuses: \$250 for completing the research project and \$750 for attaining the student achievement goal. One individual received \$250 for completing the project (goal not met).

Student Assessment Target – meeting a pre-determined target with students on one of the district-adopted assessments: Three teams submitted VIP applications in this category. One team met its goal and members received \$1,000. Two teams did not attain their goals and did not receive any bonus.

Other Target related to the School Improvement Plan or District Improvement Plan that will impact student achievement: One individual and two teams submitted projects in this category. One team dropped out at the beginning of the year. The remaining team and the individual met their goals and each participant received \$1,000.

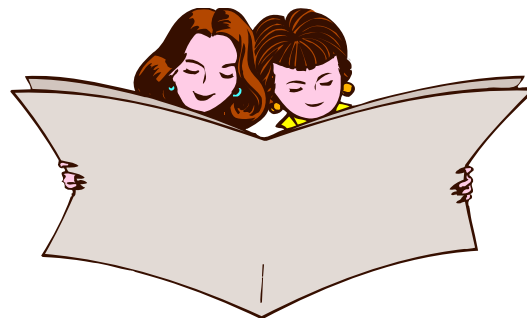

Fort Lupton is hosting a series of events the weekend after Labor Day centered on the theme "Hometown Heroes". The schedule of events begins on Thursday, September 9 with the Yellowball Golf Classic held at Coyote Creek Golf Course. The 8 am tee-off time event benefits the Kelly Martinez Cancer Fund and the Fort Lupton Chamber of Commerce.

The Trapper Days action continues at the "Trapper Rendezvous" on Friday, September 10 with flint steel fire-starting, period costumes, and family fun at the reconstructed fort located at Weld County Road 14-1/2 and Highway 85. The rendezvous is open Friday and Saturday from 9am to 6 pm. From 12 pm to 4 pm on Saturday, tours will be held at the historic Donelson House and Independence Schoolhouse. Saturday night features an old-fashioned "fandango" hosted by the South Platte Valley Historical Society from 7 pm to 10 pm.

Friday night's highlights include family night at the Fort Lupton Community Center from 5 pm to 8 pm. There will be food, games, and live entertainment. The community center is located on the east end of Fort Lupton at Rollie and First Avenue.
